





WARWICK FYFE, Helden Bass-Baritone

Helden Bass-Baritone Warwick Fyfe is a Helpmann Award-winning opera singer and Churchill Fellow, Wagner Society in NSW member and Sponsorship recipient, and one of Australia's most highly respected singers and exponents of the Wagnerian repertoire. He may be the only singer to have sung Wotan and Alberich in two separate *Ring* productions in a calendar year. And a Hunding as well.

Warwick Olney Fyfe is one of Australia's leading opera singers. He is best known for his performances in Wagner operas, which have won him many plaudits. He has also excelled in the widest possible range of repertoire, and in particular, is highly regarded for his comedic work.

As a performer, Warwick draws inspiration from a wide variety of sources, including literature, art, film, personal experiences, current events, and the world around us. Indeed, as



he makes his way through life, he tries to be like a sponge. Warwick takes the view that if a performer is an empty vessel, nothing interesting can come out of him / her. Art cannot be fluked. To this end, he believes in the German concept of 'Bildung' - the onus of intelligibility and the vital importance of having a rich cultural hinterland.

Coming up in 2024: the Speaker in *Gurrelieder* with the SSO under Simone Young, Scarpia in *Tosca* for OA and Vodnik in *Rusalka* for WA Opera.

Background: Born in Canberra, Australia, Warwick is an alumnus of the Victoria College of Arts (Melbourne University), the Canberra School of Music.
